
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Community Health Partnership (CHP) is a consortium of federally qualified health center and community clinics in Santa Clara and San Mateo counties with the mission to increase access to affordable health services for our diverse and multicultural communities regardless of socioeconomic, ethnic, religious, or cultural background, and to support our member organizations in achieving these goals. The role of South Bay AHEC in the community is to facilitate and link academic needs and training with community workforce priorities.

South Bay AHEC works with health centers, community organizations, and academic institutions to provide community-based clinical experience for health professions students and residents; provide professional education for practicing health professionals;

The South Bay AHEC provides training in partnership with CHP initiatives and programs including: Emergency Preparedness; Health Coverage Initiatives; Quality Improvement (QI) Initiatives; San Jose AIDS Education Training Center; and Women's Health Programs.

In addition, the South Bay AHEC works with Stanford University medical students and residents from the O'Conner Family Medicine Residency and high school medical academies in the South SF Bay.

OUTCOMES 2013-14:

- 111 Certified Enrollment Counselors trained
- 370 health professionals received continuing education on HIV/AIDs care, QI and women's health
- 2 medical students participated in newly formed Longitudinal Primary Care Community Partnership with Stanford University
- 3 FM residents mentored high school students in the Diabetes Health Coaching project

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
