San Francisco AHEC (Area Health Education Center) is looking for **health professional students who want to supplement their education by partnering with Community Health Centers** to improve the health of under-served San Francisco residents.

The San Francisco AHEC Scholars in Community Health Program provides a **2-Year interdisciplinary curriculum** designed for students **currently enrolled in a health professions degree or certificate program** and **at least two years from program or degree completion.**

A **1-Year Option** is available for Community Health Workers (CHW), LVN, CNA, Medical Assistants, Dental Assistants/Hygienists, Pharmacy Assistants

Who Is Eligible?

One-Year Scholars

- Licensed Vocational Nurses
- Certified Nursing Assistants
- Dental Assistants/Hygienists
- Pharmacy Assistants
- Community Health Workers

Two-Year Scholars

- Master's in Social Work
- Master's in Psychology
- Dentistry
- Medical School (MD, DO)
- Nursing (RN)
- Physician's Assistants
- Public Health (Undergraduate and Graduate)



Three Core Components

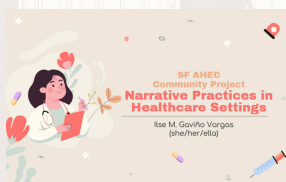


The AHEC Scholars Program has three (3) main components:

1. **Virtual modules, discussion forums, and activities** on a variety of public and community health topics.
2. **Volunteer/Intern Hours** at an SFCCC Member Clinic or other approved site.
3. A **Community-Based Health Project** at the Scholar's Internship Site, addressing an identified community health need.

The AHEC Scholars commit **80-Hours Per Year** for each year they are a part of the program.
